We are delighted to report that our efforts made a positive impact in their lives and their communities, and it also strengthened our solidarity with the realisation that, they are never alone.

MIDDLEBURG ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE NETWORK (MEJN)

For the past couple of months, MEJN has been struggling to find a way to assist people during the COVID-19 lockdown, as most families have lost their capacity to provide food and other necessities due to restrictions. What was apparent was that the levels of poverty will be high as most children relied on school nutrition programs for their daily meal.

As MEJN we were lucky to have partnered with Groundwork and MEJCON-SA on our daily environmental and social justice struggles, and when the lockdown hit us hard, they were there to assist.

MEJCON-SA managed to raise funds to assist people with food parcels and we covered both Middelburg and Witbank in our efforts. We managed to distribute food parcels to a total of 100 families, which we identified through our volunteers. But also Groundwork came up with a similar initiative to support activists and community members. The process of giving people a grant meant people could take a decision on how they spend the money. To MEJN this meant a great deal as we are part of the campaign for a basic income grant.

We would like to thank both MEJCON and Groundwork for the support they gave us, as an organisation but most importantly the community people we interact with daily.

It has been a long struggle for many members of our community including Ncebalmi Ngozo who heads a family with his siblings. He is currently waste pickers and an operator of a grass cutter for garden service which is seasonal. If it wasn't for the only assistance offered by groundWork through HEJN I have no idea how we could have survived. It was a huge burden on our shoulders to survive with my siblings, providing food on a table was a daily stress because seeing your loved ones starve while you watch is trauma, but this relief came at a time when all hope was lost and gone"
